#### 2. Why was Stoffel taken to hospital?

Because he was injured in a serious car accident / crash.

- The other driver died.
- Stoffel's heart stopped beating.
- The other driver's wife agreed to the heart transplant.

Inga: bad-tempered, caring, concerned, generous, heartless, impatient

concerned	She grasped his hand and then rushed out of the room to call for a doctor (I. 1-2)
generous	It was her idea (I. 36) to cash in his life insurance.

### Martinus: disapproving, helpful, indifferent, inquisitive, racist, supportive

helpful	With the help of Martimus de jong (l. 33)
	We could help by doubling the amount you have to spend (l. 39)
inquisitive	Have you told Inga (l. 35)
	How do you intend to spend the money ? (1.37)
supportive	He assured him his job () would be waiting for him (l. 27)

#### 9. Why did Stoffel choose a period of three years? (I. 34)

He chose a period of three years because the surgeon had told him he would live "three possible four years". (I. 22)

## 10. What "other plans" did Stoffel have in mind? (I.32) Did he carry them out? (50 words)

He intended to buy books, rugby balls and cricket bats in order to set up a school for black children. He actually did it recruiting youngsters from the streets, and trying to teach and educate them, thus saving them from delinquency and preventing them from being involved in crime.

## 11. What did Martinus mean when he referred to "the past mistakes" of others (I.49)

He meant the racist acts, the so-called mistakes white people had committed at the time of apartheid.

## 12. How far was the surgeon right in his prognosis? Justify in your own words.

Stoffel died exactly four years one month and eleven days after the operation. Therefore the surgeon's prognosis was fairly accurate.

## 13. To what extent is the title 'A Change of Heart' well-chosen? (40 words)

The title has two meanings: he actually had his heart changed physically but also spiritually. Stoffel changed after his operation, Indeed the transplant made him realize it was high time black and white people joined hands and worked together.

## 15. What does the use of the modal 'would' reveal about Stoffel's new life in Crossroads in 'he would teach English to the children'?

It reveals Stoffel's daily routine, something he did on a regular basis every day.
